

"Selective attention dominoes"

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The cards in this original and creative domino game are hexagonal.

The game comprises 28 reversible domino cards and 15 round cards that serve as counters to know how many games each player has won. They are made from thick, robust, very hardwearing, high quality cardboard.

The cardboard used is environmentally-friendly and sourced from sustainable forests. It contains a high percentage of recycled material and is 100% recyclable.

RECOMMENDED AGE GROUP





Children aged 3 to 8.

This domino game is particularly recommended for working on selective attention through associating the different shapes and colours. Although the recommended age group is 3 to 8, given the size of the cards and their images and the original nature of the game make it equally attractive to adults as it is to children.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- To develop selective or focused attention skills which allow the different attributes
 of the cards to be processed in terms of shape and colour, focusing on just one of
 them.
- To enhance observation and concentration skills.
- To work on recognizing shapes and colours.
- To improve visual-spatial intelligence.
- To encourage creativity.




GAME OPTIONS

There are a variety of game options and many of them can be combined, which allows multiple ways of playing:

FRONT, BACK, OR BOTH SIDES OF THE CARDS


Front (Kraft background): Play with just the Kraft side of the cards.



Back (coloured background): Play with just the cards with a coloured background.




Back and front: Play with both sides of the cards.






SELECTIVE ATTENTION: SHAPE AND COLOUR

Attention to shape: The game focuses on the shape of the figures on the cards.



Attention to colour: The game focuses on the colour. White and the Kraft colour do not count as colours for making associations.




Attention to shape and colour: The game focuses on both shape and colour.






CLASSIC DOMINO AND CREATIVE DOMINO

Classic domino: The game starts with a double card and continues by following on from just one end of each card.



Creative domino: The game starts with a double card and players can place the next card against any of the hexagonal sides of the cards already placed.





SYSTEM OF PLAY:

- 1. Decide which type of game you want to play before starting (front/back or both, shape/colour or both, and classic or creative).
- 2. Shuffle all the domino cards and deal them out to the players (maximum of 7 cards per player). If there are cards left over, put them in a pile on the table.
- 3. The youngest player with a double card starts the game; i.e. a card with two identical shapes (even if you are playing the COLOUR option, the starting card will be one with two identical shapes).
- 4. In each turn, the players have to put down one of their cards that matches one of the shapes/colours of the ends of the cards already on the table (in the CLASSIC game), or any of the card sides (in the CREATIVE game). If the player has no matching card, they take one from the pile until they can place one. If there are no cards left in the pile, the turn passes to the next player.
- 5. The winner is the first player to use up all their cards.
- 6. If the game cannot continue, the winner is the player with the fewest cards. If there is a tie, the winner/s will be the player/s who matched using the lowest number of cards.
- 7. The winner or winners collect a star so they can keep track of the number of games won.
